Virgin on greatness

Virgin Steele fans have been well served by the band recently, and this reissue is no exception, thanks partly to the dedication of vocalist/lyricist/ keyboardist David DeFeis, whose heartfelt vision these epic albums represent.

After entering the 90s with the not-bad Life Among The Ruins (strong on bluesy riffs, lacking in pomposity), the band defied expectations by returning, in 1994, with The Marriage Of Heaven And Hell Part One, an album that utterly ignored the contemporary metal landscape, bringing together the epic quality of Dio with the grandiosity (and virtuosity) of early Queen, as filtered through a baroque-romantic sensibility. It remains a thrilling, accessible and passionate collection of power metal songs, too subtle to be called anthems, too turned-upto-11 to be anything else.

A year later, the even more classically influenced Part Two arrived. Often considered Virgin Steele's mazsterpiece, it remains hugely impressive, but slightly lacking the commercial edge of its predecessor; the pair are ideally best heard together. This attractively designed set has notes by DeFeis and Bryan Reesman, plus lyrics, photos and a few well-chosen bonus tracks. The right way to reissue epic metal albums. William Pinfold
